







I will be traveling to Swaziland, with 34 teammates from the Red Door High School Ministry next summer. Our 15 days of service will be at our Thembeni care facility, where the Red Door HSM has been planting seeds of hope since 2007. The picture to the left is a 40 foot container, we shipped filled with building supplies and playground equipment.

Over the past 11 years, Red Door students have been busy building at our care facility. Currently, we have a drinking well, a kitchen, a medical hut, a church building, a playground and more. Here hundreds of AIDS orphans gather for daily meals and mentorship. With our arrival, a daily winter camp for kids will spring to life, filling the air with excitement, hope, and the good news.

During my stay, I will travel daily to area schools, where we will distribute school supplies, host assemblies and provide local students with a Q&A forum aimed at increasing the importance of staying in school, how to end the spread of AIDS and how faith plays a major role in both. After our school visits, construction projects will start up at our care facility and in the community.

We will also be hosting a community medical clinic with doctors who will perform medical checkups, treat illnesses/injuries and prevent the spread of HIV through testing and education. Our team will then carry out nightly home visitations with children at risk. These children will receive a months worth of food and other life essentials.

In order to keep the cost of this 15 day trip under \$2,000 (including airfare), I will be preparing my own meals, sleeping in a sleeping bag and "rough it" during my stay. Needless to say, I will your prayer support and if possible some financial assistance too.
